



Young Legislators Program Summary and Highlights

The Young Legislators Program consists of a six-month long program that provides selected students from the 41st Assembly district an opportunity to learn about the legislative process, services provided to constituents by elected leaders, and the relationship between local and state governments. The Young Legislators will meet once a month from January to June (schedule to be announced).

2016 Highlights

Session One: Kickoff at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena with guest speaker Dr. Raphael Sonenshein, Executive Director at the Pat Brown Institute for Public Affairs.

Session Two: Discussion around higher education issues at the University of La Verne with tour of campus.

Session Three: Discussion around transportation issues at the Foothill Gold Line Maintenance Operation and Transportation Office with tour of facilities.

Session Four: Discussion around water and environmental issues at the Claremont Water Treatment Center with tour of facilities.

Session Five: Discussion around science and technology at Caltech University with tour of campus facilities and labs.

Session Six: Two-day road trip to Northern California. **Day one** – Tour of the Facebook headquarters in Menlo Park followed by a panel discussion with members of Facebook’s government affairs team. **Day two** – Tour of State Capitol building, met Assemblymember Holden and attended committee hearings.
